Dear Parents/Carers,

## Uniform

## Morning Punctuality and Safeguarding

Both Barnes Farm Schools open their doors in the morning to pupils between **8:45am and 8:55am**. Towards the end of the term, there was an increasing drift of pupils arriving after this time. Similarly, there were some pupils dropped off at school at around 8:20am and waiting in the playground on their own; this is too early.

In the interests of keeping our children safer once dropped off, the 'top' gate by the Henniker Gate footpath will not be opened from now on. The main gated entrance to the school will always be staffed from 8:45am onwards. Can all parents/carers please aim for the morning 'window' to begin the day safely and on time?

## Homework

In line with the Infants, we are currently revising our homework policy and approach. After consultation with parents through our Governing Body and at Parent Voice, we will launch our new approach towards the end of this term. For now, there are the following minimum expectations:

Upper School (Y5/6)	One piece of Maths and Literacy per week
Lower School (Y3/4)	Maths and Literacy alternate weeks

Alongside this homework should be the ever-important reading practice. Headteacher's homework is due by Friday 9<sup>th</sup> January. This can be uploaded by pupils logging into their school website account and completing the homework assignment section.

## Polling Day Closure

It is with regret and after much consideration, both schools will have to close to pupils on **Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> May 2015**. The school has been commissioned as a polling station for the General Election and with the expected turnout, we cannot assure ourselves of the usual high levels safety of the pupils in our care.
