BFJS supports launch of 'I Didn't Know' Campaign

The Essex Safeguarding Children's Board (ESCB) has recently launched a campaign to raise awareness of the important and sensitive subject of child exploitation (CSE). CSE involves someone or several people forcing or manipulating a child or young person into unwanted acts in exchange for something. This 'exchange' could be money, gifts, alcohol or drugs, or it could be 'status' in a group or gang. It can occur online through computers, tablets or phones (sometimes through games where gifts are traded, for example) CSE is child abuse and is often reported as a hidden crime, it can happen to any child in any community; it can affect girls and young women as well as boys and young men. Children and young people will seldom be aware that they are being exploited.

The ESCB has asked every school to write directly to parents about a campaign to combat CSE called 'I Didn't Know'. More materials are on our website in the 'safeguarding' area including links to a free and short online course that parents can take to find out more. I strongly encourage you to read these materials.
