School Clubs— Please note the letter going out regarding extra spaces.



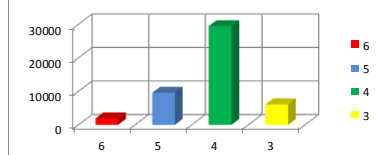
