Learning Updates from around school

Barnes Farm Schools strengthen their critical incident planning

This week saw both Barnes Farm Schools launch two new drills to further strengthen our safeguarding of pupils in the event of an emergency. Following staff training on Monday and an assembly on Tuesday we practised a drill named 'Shelter' on Wednesday lunchtime. This is needed where there is an environmental condition or other danger where staying outside would prove dangerous. The children practised coming inside to their classrooms following a signal. We will repeat this drill on a termly basis. Tomorrow, the children will be practising a full evacuation of the school site. This is a highly unlikely eventuality but one that we need to go through once a year from now on. We have approached this difficult topic with the children under the banner of 'being prepared'. This would be an ideal time to have similar conversations in your own home if they haven't already happened around 'what if' incidents linked to fire safety or other emergency situations in the home.
