Plans for September






School Games Award

Year 4 Tigers staged a Greek Battle on the Hill! They built the shields and armour from cardboard, making the designs after researching the Ancient Greeks this term.



Scarlett (Year 3) made a bird with her craft materials.








Stanley (Year 5) created this 'Trash Trigon' out of recyclable materials. This was a project from our Ancient Greeks topic.
