This year's SATS results - We are delighted to report that the recent SATs results showed a consolidating of our 'significantly above' national attainment position. Nationally, the results have seen a sharp rise since last year and our results have matched this. Reading continues as a strength with the improvement in Maths over the past few years most marked. Writing, with the 'secure fit' model, continues to be a challenge and has remained on a stable footing this year, continuing to be above the national figure.

<u>OFSTED update</u> — we knew another school inspection was due before the end of term and it finally occurred on Wednesday 12th and Thursday 13th July. We are limited by the amount we can share at this point but we are greatly looking forward to the publication of the report in September 2017. Multi Academy Trust (MAT) update - we are continuing through the due diligence processes with a view to Barnes Farm Juniors joining with 5 local schools to form a MAT, and you will have received a letter earlier updating you on the process. Based on the current timelines, we expect the full consultation to go out to parents and staff late October 2017, to give you the opportunity to have your say. The respective Head Teachers and Chairs have been working hard some time to bring this opportunity to you, along with the governors are doing everything we can to ensure this represents the best opportunity for the school and our children going forwards
