


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# **3SG Class Assembly**

#### Restorative Justice and Mediation Service.

This is a scheme, run by The Essex Restorative Justice and Mediation Service, which will allow victims of crime and anti-social behaviour (such as neighbour disputes) the chance to communicate with the perpetrator/s.

There is currently an opportunity for people who have the ability to learn skills that would allow them to assist the Service.

The Essex Restorative Justice and Mediation Service facilitates safe communication between those involved in a crime or conflict and allows victims to ask questions and receive meaningful reparation for the harm that has been caused. They are looking for volunteers to help them to deliver this provision.

- You would become part of a friendly and supportive team
- You would be able to fit this role around your existing commitments
