The Year of the Ox



What Is the Chinese Horoscope?

Each new lunar year in Chinese **culture** is shown by an animal. There are 12 animals altogether. This tradition is thousands of years old and is believed to have first begun with a story.

It is said that Buddha asked all of the animals on Earth to come and see him. However, only 12 animals answered his call. Buddha gave each one of these animals their own year in the Chinese zodiac cycle as a way of saying thank you.

Did You Know...?

Some versions of the story have the Jade Emperor as the main character and others have Buddha. However, all of the stories are very similar and talk about the same animals.

When Does the Year of the Ox Start?

The Year of the Ox begins on 12th February 2021. It is the 4719th year of the Chinese calendar. Once the Year of the Ox is over, the next will not begin again until 31st January 2033.



Chinese New Year Dance Activities



Chinese New Year celebrations often have a dragon dance. Can you do three actions that show how a dragon might move?

Spring rolls for Chinese New Year

Always cook with an adult.





Ingredients

- 1 packet spring roll
 wrappers or filo pastry
- 500 g lean beef mince
- 1 tsp Chinese fivespice
- 3 tbs soy sauce
- 1 packet salad mix
- olive oil (for frying)
- sweet chilli sauce (*to serve)

Method



Remove spring roll wrappers from the freezer and allow to defrost.



In a non-stick pan, brown mince and continue cooking until the fat renders (runs out of the mince) and then drain off the excess fat and discard.



Add five spice powder, soy sauce and vegetables to mince and cook for a few minutes until vegetables have softened slightly.



Allow the mince to cool while you are separating the spring roll wrappers.



With a spring roll wrapper corner facing you, scoop a couple of tablespoons of filling across the paper, leaving enough room for the sides to be folded in. Fold the side corners in and roll it up into a log form as tightly as you can.



Heat a little olive oil in a non stick frypan over medium heat and gently brown each side until golden and crunchy. Serve with sweet chilli sauce.















Recycled Water Bottle Dragons

You will need:

empty plastic bottles
diluted acrylic paint
glitter
scissors
roll of chicken wire
cardboard
collage materials
2 ping pong balls
2 paper cups
old felt tip lids





Instructions

- 1. Collect a substantial amount of empty water bottles.
- 2. Pour diluted acrylic paint into the bottles. Choose one colour per bottle. Glitter and flakes can also be put inside, if required.
- 3. Put the lid on and shake the paint inside to cover the bottle.
- 4. Empty the paint out, leave the lid off and leave to dry.



- 5. Carefully cut the bottle from the bottom in a spiral motion. Beware of the sharp plastic edges. Leave the bottle neck intact for attaching.
- 6. Roll the chicken wire into a cylindrical shape.
- 7. Attach the bottles through the wire or thread string through the neck and tie onto the chicken wire.
- 8. For the dragon head, make a large cardboard face and collage to make the eyes and mouth. The eyes could be ping pong balls inside polystyrene cups. For the teeth, use old felt tip pen lids.

To make the tissue paper version of the water bottle dragons, instead of using paint, glue tissue paper around the bottles. Leave the ends longer, and twist into a tail or tassel-like shape. The bottles do not need cutting into spirals with this technique.





Paper Lantern

You will need:

Lantern Template

Red paper (optional)


Red and gold paint/coloured pens

Scissors

Glue

Sticky tape

Stapler



Instructions

- 1. Print the Lantern Template onto plain or red paper, as desired.
- 2. Cut off one end of the paper and set aside to make the handle.
- 3. Decorate the sheet using coloured pens or paint (red and gold are the traditional Chinese New Year colours).
- 4. Fold the paper in half lengthwise along the dashed line.
- 5. Cut along the marked lines on the sheet Do not cut to the edge of the paper.
- 6. Unfold the paper.
- 7. Curve the paper round to form a cylinder shape.
- 8. Tape the two ends of the paper together to create your lantern.
- 9. Staple the handle to the top of the lantern.
