#### **WhatsApp Guidance**

We have previously advised parents about the age rating for the use of WhatsApp. The official rating is 16+. Commonsense media advises 14+.

There have been recent examples of children finding the use of this app challenging to deal with (around being added/removed from groups etc). It has also been reported that parents are allegedly messaging other children from their child's account when difficulties occur. Our advice is for our school-aged children not to use WhatsApp. Our advice is also that if parents need to deal with any issue related to school, that they contact the school directly rather than another child in this instance.
