#### **Events 2016-17**

### Easter Craft Morning - 2016

A fantastic Combination of Easter and Mother's Day crafts was well received and although the morning did seem quieter than normal, this did mean that children were able to move between the craft options more easily and without delays. Including the proceeds from the eagerly anticipated chocolate raffle we are pleased to report that we raised a combined total of £248.01

We take this opportunity to thank the craft team for their organization, innovation and wonderful attention to detail. We would not have such great crafting events without the dedication of this small team who dedicate many hours of their time to these events.

#### Bag 2School - April 2016

This minimal effort fundraiser saw us receive a cheque for £220 which was well received and as a direct result of the kind donations of clothes and shoes from parents.

#### Infant/Junior Discos - May/October 2016

We continue to work with Jazz It Up entertainment for these energetic and fun filled events, held in May and October for the Infants and Juniors respectively. Each event runs two sessions to segregate the lower and upper year groups to ensure enjoyment and safety for all attendees.

The children were provided with drinks, sweets and crisps included in the cost of their tickets and all had a great time.

The Discos raised £825.85 in total and Jazz was also secured for the disco dates in 2017.

#### Summer Fete - July 2016

This was the second summer fete which proved even more profitable that our first event held in 2015.

Many lessons learnt from the first event were considered and applied to help improve the general running and organisation of this large scale whole school get together.

We continued to receive support from local businesses such as Miller & Carter and the teaching staff were extremely helpful on the day. The tombola, stalls and barrow of booze were all very well supported and we raised an excellent sum of £2202.31.

#### Winter Bazaar - November 2016

Another extremely well attended event – with lots of stalls, festive refreshments and fun to be had by all involved. The children got fully involved and we intend to hold an even bigger and better Winter Bazaar in 2017. We raised a very considerable £813.14 with support from local business and parents. We look forward to starting our planning soon for our forthcoming bazaar.

### **Christmas Craft Morning - December 2016**

A quieter morning for Christmas Craft this year but nonetheless very enjoyable with a festive theme and good cheer felt by all who attended. All who attend the event always say how Christmassy the event makes them feel and we thank our amazing craft team for coming up and producing some and innovative crafts for the children to put together. The chairs are very appreciative of the efforts from the Craft team and thank them by way of this letter for their involvement, time and dedication to our fundraising efforts. We raised a very impressive £301.81

The first donation for £2500.00 to each school was made in January 2016 and consisted of some funds raised and carried over from the 2015/6 period. A further £1500.00 was donated to each school in October 2016. Totalling an impressive £8000.00 overall.
