Please check if your circumstances have changed due to the current situation. At the moment, this would equate to receiving £15 worth of supermarket vouchers per week, per child.



Lily from Year 6 has been creative with chalks, sending a positive message of thanks to NHS and Key Workers.












Zak (Year 4) and Parisa (Year 3) have been having fun working with the rest of their family.
