Music sessions take place in school every week and help to build confidence whilst also teaching resilience, teamwork and listening skills. Music workshops will be held in school soon, so the children can try out the instruments and learn all about being a musician in a band.

There is a Rocksteady Workshop demo tonight at the Display evening at 6:15pm in the Hall!

If you are interested in the sessions your child can learn either drums, guitar, keyboard or vocals within their very own band. Sessions are taught by highly trained musicians and are fun, inclusive and accessible to all. At the end of each term, the bands perform a concert for the school and their families, so you can see how far they have come! All instruments are provided and no experience is necessary. Payment is £31.25 payable by monthly direct debit.
