Dear Parent/Carer.

We believe that promoting the health and wellbeing of our pupils is an important part of their overall education. We do this through Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education. These lessons look at many topics, including physical/emotional health, all kind of relationships and living in the wider world. The aim of our PSHE lessons is to help our pupils make safe and informed decisions during their school years and beyond.

Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) is an important part of the PSHE curriculum; it provides pupils with knowledge and understanding of how the human body changes and how to form relationships in a responsible and healthy manner. We believe this will give pupils confidence to make positive choices now and in later life. Relationships Education became statutory for all primary schools from September 2020 and our policy has been recently approved.

We wanted to inform you that in the **next few weeks**, we will be teaching RSE to all pupils as part of their normal PSHE lessons.

Year 5 will be learning:

- To explore the emotional and physical changes that occur during puberty.
- To ask questions about puberty with confidence.
- To understand male and female puberty changes in more detail.
- To understand how puberty affects the reproductive organs.
- To explore the impact of puberty on the body, the importance of personal hygiene and how to keep clean.
- To explore ways to get support during puberty.

## Statutory/compulsory – part of National Curriculum for Science curriculum as well

You may find that your child starts asking questions about the topic at home, or you might want to take the opportunity to talk to your child about issues before the work is covered in school.
